Staff News

On the training day on 9.1.23 all staff were very busy. Teachers and Learning Support staff had training on maths, English, Emotion self-Regulation. Teachers also discussed provision for SEND and disadvantaged pupils. Learning Support staff had training on using the online first aid reporting system and an update on learning interventions for pupils.

On 10.1.23 Mrs Saxton undertook some Primary Engineering training to further enhance the STEM teaching EYFS. Miss Fields continues to study for her National Qualification in Leading literacy and Mrs Endacott has been working with the Great North Maths Hub as part of our Mastering Maths journey.

Mrs Gray and Mrs Stewart are currently undertaking some CPD in the Linking Leaders programme. This programme will help both teachers deepen their own subject knowledge around curriculum design and give then an opportunity to work with schools across North Tyneside and Newcastle in a set of peer reviews. The peer reviews will help highlight excellent practice and look for some key questions going forward in terms of their subjects (Geography, Music and PSHE).

Mrs Endacott is mentoring Miss Tolson through her Early Career Teaching development and meet every week to share good practice and reflect on lesson observations/training units.

In the autumn term, the Governors met several times and discussed many issues and policies. Most pressing were the budget and the pressures facing the school financially. Governors also conducted the headteacher appraisal in November. Governors received training on safeguarding and Child protection updates.
