Northumberland County Council portal for Middle School applications for September 2024 opened on September 12th and closes on 31st October – Please ensure you have applied for your child if required before this date:



Children in Reception to Year 2 – free Years 3 & 4 only £2.45



We are very grateful to parents/carers who are providing fruit as a healthy snack for their children for consumption at playtime, however me must request that this is A PIECE OF FRUIT only and not fruit in plastic pots.

We have seen an increase in children walking around the yard with pots of grapes, berries and sliced up fruit and even had bowls of fruit with plastic forks being taken outside at playtime. This is not something which is permitted and we ask that this be stopped with immediate effect.

Children are permitted to take outside an apple, orange, banana etc and these pieces of fruit need to be within their school bag and NOT in packed lunch boxes as children will not be given access to these before lunchtime. Thank you for your support with this.

New Governor opportunities:

Two vacancies have arisen on the Governing Body of Holywell Village First School for the appointment of a Parent Governor. All Parent Governors must have children at the school (as parent or carer) and must also be elected by the parents and carers of pupils at the school. The period of office for service as a Parent Governor is 4 years and a Parent Governor would not be obliged to resign from office if his/her child leaves the school; they would be able to remain in office until the expiry of the term of office.

The role of Governor can be hugely rewarding in terms of the impact that you can have on the outcomes for children as well as the opportunity to learn and develop new skills that can be of benefit to you beyond the school community.
