

Statement about Pupil Premium

For the financial year 2013-2014 the school received £21,213 in Pupil Premium funding.

The money was used in the following ways

- Provision of interventions for children to improve their skills in communication, reading, writing and maths
- Provision of 1-1 tuition for identified pupils
- Provision of support for children experiencing personal, social and/or emotional issues
- Subsidence of educational visits where appropriate
- Subsidence of extra-curricular clubs where appropriate
- Provision of CPD for lunchtime supervisors in promoting positive playtimes
- Provision of CPD to for support staff in physical restraint and positive handling
- Purchased support package from the Local Authority to support the Leadership and Management Team in developing effective Pupil Premium strategies.

School averages compare favourably to the national expectation for Average Points Scores which is 3 points.
