FORTNIGHTLY NEWSLETTER

We have received a number of concerns from parents/carers around vehicles picking up and dropping off children in the streets adjacent to school. We have received reports of cars parked on the turning circle, blocking driveways and even just left running.

The statistics surrounding air quality and air pollution around schools are phenomenal. The effects of this particle pollution are felt most by babies and children as they are at a height where directly inhaling the traffic fumes emitted from vehicles.

Test show babies and children are affected

a third more than adults.

Long-term health effects can include chronic respiratory disease, lung cancer, heart disease, and even damage to the brain, nerves, liver, or kidneys. Continual exposure to air pollution affects the lungs of growing children and may aggravate or complicate medical conditions in the elderly.

Experts advise where possible to walk don't drive and to certainly try and keep the areas surrounding schools as car free as possible. Don't leave cars running as this is especially damaging to the children passing by.

Where practical parents should choose quieter routes, away from traffic, as this can cut pollution exposure by almost two-thirds.

Other scientists have suggested parents use covers on their prams and buggies during the school run to protect their infants from air pollution.

Half of all children walk to school, but being driven to school by car instead can actually result in greater pollution exposure for those inside the vehicle, previous research has shown.

Please help us to improve the air quality around our school for all of the children and be considerate when leaving your vehicle.
