Statement about Pupil Premium

For the financial year 2012-2013 the school received £8,349 in Pupil Premium funding.

The money was used in the following ways

- To provide interventions for children to improve their skills in reading, writing and maths
- To provide targeted children with one-to-one tuition improving writing skills
- To provide support for children experiencing personal, social and/or emotional issues
- To subsidise educational visits and swimming.

For the financial year 2013/14 the school will receive £20192 in Pupil Premium funding.

The money will be used in the following ways:

- To provide 1-1 tuition for identified pupils
- To provide support for children experiencing personal, social and/or emotional issues
- To subsidise educational visits where appropriate
- To subside extra-curricular clubs where appropriate
- To provide CPD for lunchtime supervisors in promoting positive playtimes
- To procure services from the Local Authority to support the Leadership and Management Team in developing effective Pupil Premium strategies.
