## Welcome Back.....

Welcome back! We are pleased to welcome all of the children into school this week, along with some new faces. As you can see, school has undertaken some major renovations over the summer arranged and funded by Northumberland County Council. Team Build Construction were employed to undertake the project which included removing the old central heating system and replacing it with 78 new radiators and surface mounted pipework. The project also saw the installation of 138 new uPVC windows and cladding to court yard areas of the building. The team did extremely well to

will not affect the children or school at all.

Our beautiful new windows are coated with a privacy film to both protect the interior and raise energy efficiencythis coating is VERY expensive. With this in mind, we kindly request that adults refrain from touching or knocking on the windows. The children have all been advised that although they can see out onto the yard, the adults on the yard cannot see them and have also been discouraged from touching or knocking on the windows. Thank you for your understanding.

We have noticed already the temperature difference in school and are looking forward to a toasty warm winter without the need for portable heaters and thermal clothing!

Mrs Brett and Mrs Reed were on site throughout the works (wearing appropriate safety attire of course) and apart from a very sad burglary incident, everything went swimmingly.



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### WHOLE SCHOOL TOPIC-KEEPING SAFE AND PEOPLE WHO HELP US

We are very lucky to have lots of local emergency responders coming into school to talk to the children in the coming weeks about keeping safe.

The first of our special visitors will be in school next Thursday 13th September.

Tynemouth Volunteer Life Brigade will be in school with one of their emergency vehicles and will be talking to the children about water dangers and keeping safe around water. The children will then get the chance to see their vehicle and equipment used in rescues.



The following week we have the Fire Service joining us with their appliance. They will talk to the children about fire safety and conduct classroom workshops. The children will get the chance to look inside the appliance and at fire rescue equipment.



Our final visit is from Northumbria Police who will be coming into school to talk with all of children about Road Safety and will be carrying out stranger danger workshops.

We are so very grateful to these people for giving up their valuable time to visit us and share their knowledge with the children.
