Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Why are superheroes good? Why are baddies bad? We will talk to the children about doing the right things and the different rules they have to follow, and how to be a good citizen.

Talk about the people who help us in life, and why they are special.

Talk about Easter, Mothers day and ways in which we celebrate these events.

We have been watching the children's play carefully add cannot help but notice their fascination with all things superhero, goodies and baddies! So this half term we are becoming 'Super Nursery'.

We will also be learning about Easter and taking part in activities surrounding Easter celebrations.

Physical Development

The children will continue to take part in weekly Physical

Literacy PE sessions where they will be developing their super speed, super strength, and super balance.

Learning about super foods and how they are good for our bodies.

Opportunities for mark making in role play area. Activities to develop find and gross motor skills.

Superhero's

Language and Communication

Our little superheroes are making good progress with Letters and Sounds Phase 1 activities and will continue listening attention activities, and sound discrimination activities.

We will be talking lots about Superheroes and problem solving answering who, what, how and why questions to expand our thinking and speaking skills.

Retelling stories and discussing characters, and role playing.

Maths

The children will continue with counting and number recognition activities with a superhero and Easter theme.

Recognising, ordering, finding one more/less and problem solving with numbers 1-20.

Sorting objects into sets and comparing sets.

Understanding the World

We will be learning about everyday superheroes such as the police, fire fighters, doctors and nurses, and their jobs.

Tasting, and cooking with super foods. We will begin planting super foods and finding why they are good for us.

Literacy

We will begin our topic by reading Supertato by Sue Hendra, and using it to practise story retelling, talking about characters and

devising our own characters.

We will draw our own superheroes and talk and 'write' about their super powers.

Read other books relating to topic—Midnight Superhero, Super Dasiy, Super Kid.

Write cards to special people, practising writing our own names and other words. Lots of focus on recognising our name and the letters in our names.

Writing opportunities within Police Station Role Play—wanted posters, crime forms, diaries, evidence forms.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be designing and making our own superheroes. Playing super heroes and developing our skills. Our role play will be transformed into a Police Station, so we will have lots of support to defeat the baddies whilst we are role playing.

We will be taking part in Easter art and craft activities and making things to bring home.
