

EMERGENCY LOCK-DOWN PROCEDURE TEST.

We will be practicing our emergency lock-down system on Friday 7th November.

An audible 'amber' or 'red' warning will be heard over the school PA system. An amber warning keeps children and staff inside the building but free to move around, this would be used for example if there was a fox or dog on the yard etc. A red warning keeps children and staff within their classrooms and would be used in the unlikely event of an intruder attempt during school hours for example.
